Sermon Title: "Gather It In"

Scripture: Exodus 16:2-15



Autumn is upon us - officially! This is the season for gathering. It's been a rough one in the north country. Plenty of rain, but not much by way of sunshine. Still, there are blessings to be gleaned, received, celebrated.

I spoke with a friend whose husband is dying. Diagnosed with Cancer over 30 years ago, he responded in miraculous ways to treatment.. After several years the cancer returned. Presumed sterile because of the heavy doses of chemotherapy, the day his cancer returned was the day they learned they were going to have a child. Miraculous. Once again he responded well to the treatment. His life was spared, and he became the father of a strong baby boy. Blessings to be gathered in. Not long after that they would have a daughter. And soon after that, they would have another son.

But two years ago the cancer returned. There were brief seasons of remission, but this time, no miracle. Thirty years that he wasn't supposed to have. A family he was never supposed to have. Not only three children, but two grandchildren as well!

Gather the blessings today. Gather the day in with joy. With hope. With faith. Gather it in because it doesn't last forever. But gather it in such that you are mindful that you, too, will one day be "gathered" - to your people, and to your Creator! Gather the blessings, knowing that Jesus is your "bread" - your life, your hope.

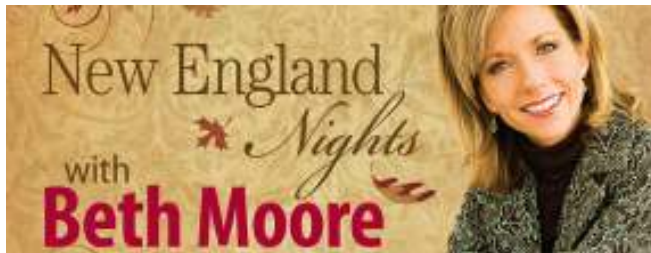

## Q and A from the National Museum of the American Indian . . .

### How did some tribes get their reputation as war-like?

How would you react to someone who came onto your land, threatened to take it from you, stole your sources of food, and threatened to kill your family?

Some of the native peoples initially looked upon the white-skinned Europeans as gods worthy of worship. They greeted the settlers with great hospitality. That is how Captain James Cook was welcomed by the native people of Hawaii. Thought to be the god Lono who was predicted to return on a floating island, he was revered. That is, "revered" until his men were involved with stolen property. After that the peaceful islanders became very war-like, killing Cook on February 14, 1779.

The Wampanoag people, present at what we commonly refer to as the "First Thanksgiving", were initially a peaceful people toward the white settlers. As the hunger by the whites for native people's lands increased, however, their attitude changed.

The word *Apache*, derived from the Zuni language, is translated as "enemy" or "fighting men". Though their reputation is most likely exaggerated, the *Apache* were known for their war-like behavior toward native and white settler alike.
